GIOVANNI TAMBURINI ELECTED PRESIDENT OF CEFS

The European Association of Sugar Manufacturers (CEFS) is pleased to announce the election of Giovanni Tamburini as its new President, following the conclusion of Paul Mesters' successful mandate. The announcement was made during the CEFS Congress held on 6 June at Pairi Daiza, Belgium.

Tamburini succeeds Paul Mesters, CEO of Cosun Beet Company, who led CEFS with distinction since 2018. Under Mesters' presidency, CEFS strengthened its advocacy at EU level, prioritised emissions reduction and sustainability, expanded its communication capacity, and engaged in key policy debates on trade, climate and competitiveness. A well-respected figure in the industry, Mesters is known not
